The competition is sanctioned by Skate Canada. The competition is organized and conducted in accordance with the current Skate Canada Rulebook. All events are open to registered skaters in good standing with Markham Skating Club and Skate Canada.

APPLICATION DEADLINE:

Skaters must be signed up on or before the following date: Saturday December 7, 2019

ARENA:

The competition will be held at Markham Village Community Centre. The ice surface is 85' x 185'.

REGISTRATION:

Registration will open 30 minutes prior to the first event on the day of competition. All events other than the first must register at least 45 minutes prior to their event time.

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

Saturday, December 21 10:00 am – 11:00 am

A detailed schedule of events will be posted on the club bulletin board in the main lobby at least one week prior to competition. The schedule will also be posted on the Markham Skating Club website (www.markhamskatingclub.com).

ASSESSMENT & CRITERIA:

Assessments will be done according to Skate Canada guidelines by Markham Skating Club coaches.

CERTIFICATES AND AWARDS:

All skaters will receive a full assessment report with performance levels achieved for each element performed. An overall performance assessment will be given with a corresponding ribbon.		

MSC CANSKATE FUN COMPETITION

Skaters are permitted to "skate up" one level in an event, but may not participate in both levels. Each flight will only use 1/3rd of the ice surface. Please note that to help our CanSkaters feel comfortable in this event, Program Assistants will be on hand to help each group as if it is a regular CanSkate session.

COMPULSORY ELEMENTS

There will be no music. Elements will be performed in the order listed. Skaters are permitted to "skate up" one level in an event but not both.

CANSKATE 2	a) b) c) d)	Qualifications: Skaters must have passed CanSkate 2. Forward Stop Forward 2 Foot Sculling Forward 2 Foot Turn (Stationary or with Speed) Backward 2 Foot Sit Glide
CANSKATE 3	a) b) c) d)	Qualifications: Skaters must have passed CanSkate 3 Backward 2 foot Sculling 2 foot turn forward to backward (with speed) Backward 2 foot Jump Forward Circle Thrusts (Clockwise or Counterclockwise)
CANSKATE 4	a) b) c) d)	Qualifications: Skaters must have passed CanSkate 4. Backward Circle Thrusts (Clockwise or Counterclockwise) Backward 360 Step Turn (Clockwise or Counterclockwise) 2 Foot Jump Forward to Backward and Backward to Forward Forward Inside Slalom
CANSKATE 5	a) b) c) d)	Qualifications: Skaters must have passed CanSkate 5. Forward 2 Foot Side Stop Backward Push/Glide Sequence, Full Perimeter Forward Power Jump Forward Crosscuts – Figure 8
CANSKATE 6	a) b) c)	Qualifications: Skaters must have passed CanSkate 6. Forward 1 Foot Side Stop (Left or Right Foot) Backward 1 Foot Slalom Forward 180 Step Turn (Mohawk: RFI – LBI or LFI – RBI)
